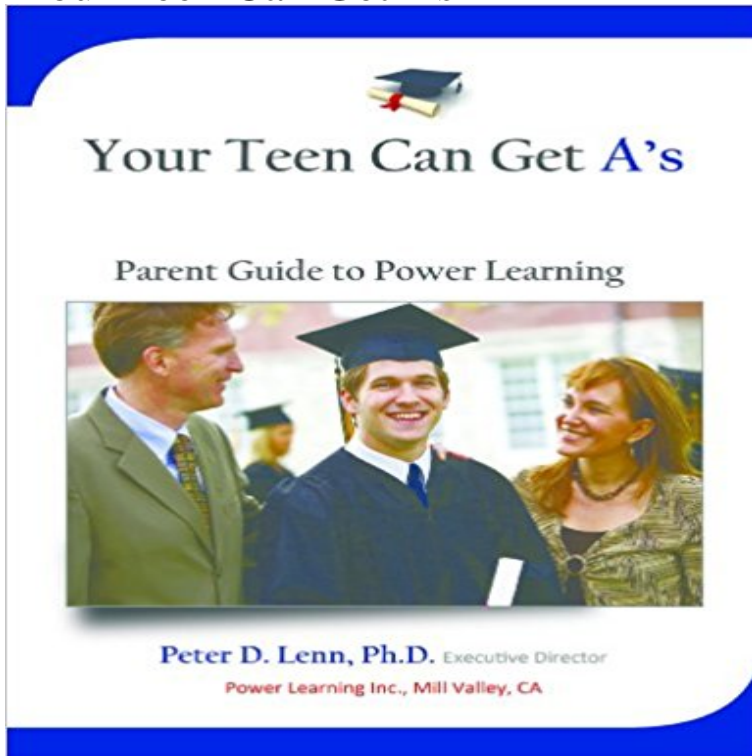


Your Teen Can Get As

Most of the practice that is essential for learning has to be done at home, where there are powerful distractions and little help. Lenn provides concrete advice on how you can help your teen to become a power learner.
